## Old Admiralty Building

The Old Admiralty Building (or Admiralty Extension) is the largest of the Admiralty Buildings and is situated between Horseguards Parade Ground and The Mall. It was begun in the late 19th century and redesigned while the construction was in progress to accommodate the extra offices needed due to the naval arms race with the German Empire. It is a red brick building with white stone detailing in the Queen Anne style with some French influences.

It was necessary for the building to be extensively cleaned and repaired in preparation for its new tenants 'The Foreign and Commonwealth Office'. We were appointed to complete these works which included the repair and repointing of gauged brickwork which had joints of less than 2mm and the dismantling and rebuilding of the chimney stacks.

Our works to the lightwells included the controlled removal of terracotta and faience blocks which had been filled with an asbestos based cementitious fill.
