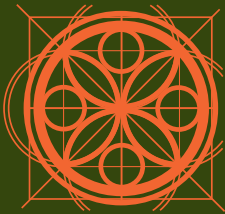


Reeds School, Watford

The site of the London Orphanage Asylum, which later became known as Reed's School after its founder Andrew Reed, had been abandoned for years, much of it was derelict and some of the buildings had to be demolished. The school was designed on a grand scale to reflect its benefactor's generosity. The central block is 32m long, 14m wide and 20m from the basement to the apex of the vast hammer beam trusses.

PAYE Stonework were appointed to clean, repair and rebuild the external fabric of the school. The works involved the indenting of replacement bricks and stone details to provide seamless repairs to a grand Victorian building.
