## The Treasury Building, Whitehall

The Treasury Building, Whitehall was built in 1845 to the designs of William Kent, Sir John Soane and Sir Charles Barry. Portland Stone was used in the construction of the facades to this Grade II listed building.

The major refurbishment involved the careful cleaning, conservation and repair of the Portland Stone forming the external cladding.

Many of the facades of the seventeen courtyards and light wells were adapted to suit the requirements of modern offices. Works involved forming numerous new openings using purpose made glazed bricks, Portland Stone and slate paving. Care was taken to ensure that new work blended seamlessly with the original.

The contract also included adaptations to form new public entrances to Churchill's Cabinet War Rooms, the formation of the new main entrance steps and ramps facing St James Park and the restoration of the terrazzo and mosaic internal floors.
