## Ypres Tower

The Ypres tower in Rye, used for centuries as a prison but now a museum, is the earliest remaining fortification dating from 1249. Rye's defences were strengthened with stone walls and 4 gateways in the 14th century after the town was destroyed in 1377. Of these only the Landgate still stands. There are no remains of the original Norman Castle.

PAYE were appointed to clean, repair and conserve the external fabric of the tower and to construct a new disabled access ramp and ticket office to ensure that the remains of the castle are retained for another hundred years for future generations to see.
