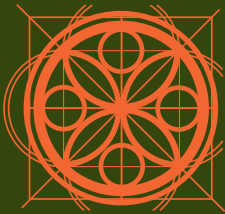


Burlington House Piccadilly

Burlington House was originally a private Palladian mansion, and was expanded in the mid 19th century after being purchased by the British government. The main building is at the northern end of the courtyard and houses the Royal Academy, while five learned societies occupy the two wings on the east and west sides of the courtyard and the Piccadilly wing at the southern end. These societies, collectively known as the Courtyard Societies are the Geological Society of London, Linnean Society of London, Royal Astronomical Society, Society of Antiquaries of London and the Royal Society of Chemistry.

PAYE were appointed in 2006 to clean, repair and conserve the external facades whilst the various societies remained in residence. Using a combination of a masons nebulous water clean and the gentle JOS abrasive system we were able to revive the appearance of the property.
