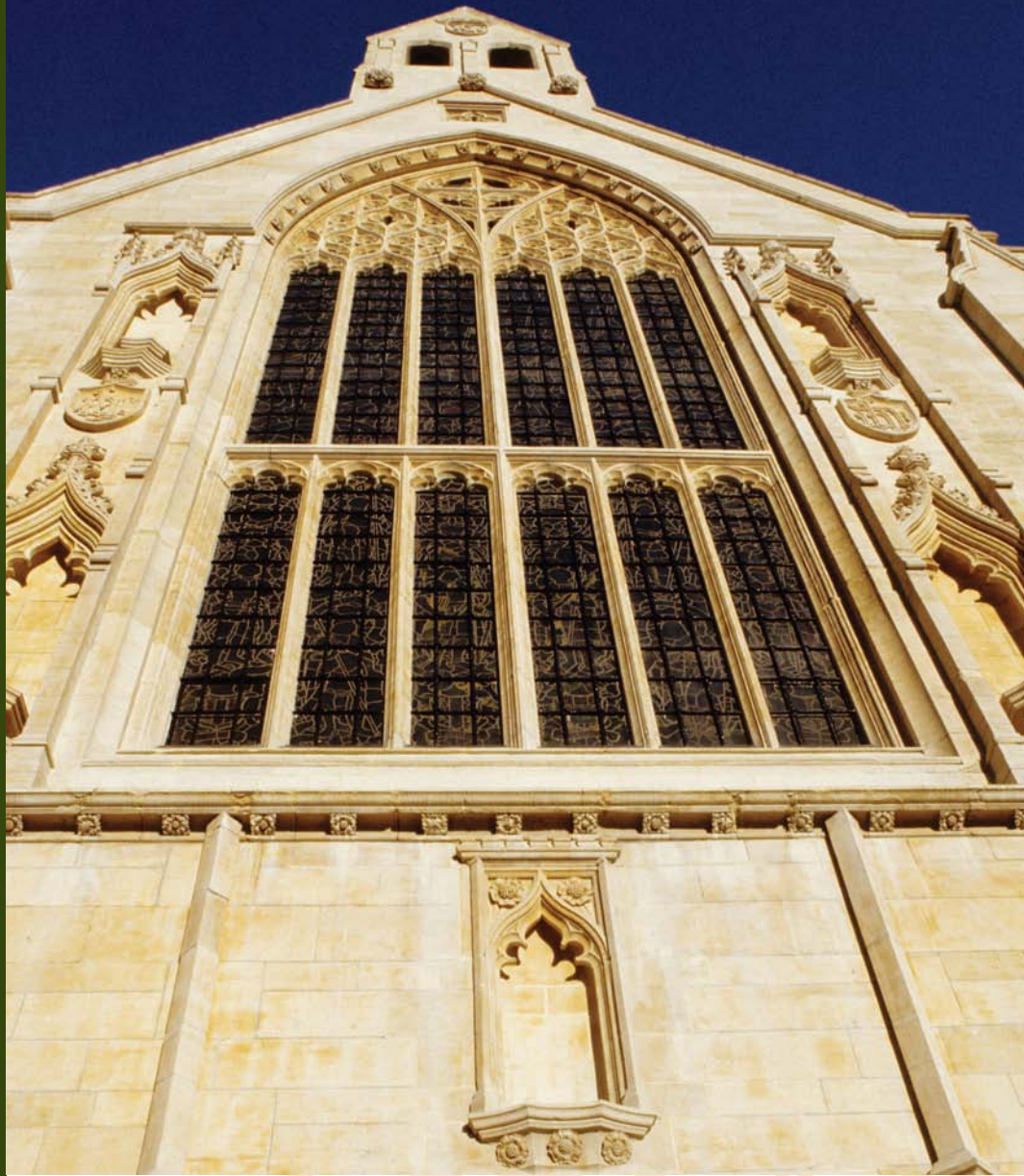

## Holy Trinity, South Kensington

Holy Trinity was a late addition to the churches of Kensington, during Queen Victoria's reign some fourteen churches were added to the borough, the design and building of which involved many of the best Victorian ecclesiastical architects of the day.

In 1901 a site was found on Prince Consort Road near the recently built Royal Albert Hall and the new church was designed by the Bodley architectural practice which often meant that you were going to get a church built in the 14th century late perpendicular style. Holy Trinity is no exception. It shows in the exterior facade, which is in this style and is said to bear a close similarity to the west front of Bury St Edmund's Cathedral.
